GENERAL INFORMATION:

Once a student is enrolled at Kansas State University in our flight program, we won't accept the transfer of ratings earned from other sources.

To request a flight evaluation for verification of credit to count toward the professional pilot degree option, students MUST have been issued the license or certificate PRIOR to the first day they are enrolled in classes at Kansas State University.

For students initially enrolling in our program, we consider the source of the ratings. FAA accredited colleges/universities and Part 141 schools in one group (group 1). All others/Part 61 schools in the other group (group 2).

- Both group 1 and 2 students must enroll in the flight lab (and pay the lab fee...typically 1-hour) for which they wish to be considered for the credit (departmental exam).
- Group 2 students must successfully complete a knowledge exam that will include written and/or oral questions beyond the FAA exam to ensure their knowledge is equivalent to a student that had completed our course. If they don't pass, they will need to enroll in the ground school course and will not be allowed to attempt the flight check.
- Both group 1 and 2 students must be evaluated in-flight, satisfactorily demonstrating all skills evaluated on prog checks in the course and in the final evaluation for the rating. This eval will support our commitment to maintaining quality standards and also be useful when advising students considering this option. The eval results will remain with their flight records regardless of the eval's results as part of their training records.
- If students successfully complete the flight evaluation, they receive credit for their rating. These students will have paid the fee for a 1-hour class and the instructor/flight time required for the in-flight evaluation. They will have saved the cost of the ground school (typically 3-hours) and the course's flight requirements (between 40-55 hours per basic rating).
- Students that fail the flight eval will receive a grade of NC (no credit) on the PPIL 101 course and will not receive any flight or ground credits toward their degree as a result of the departmental exam.

Notes for Matrix Use:

- **CR** Transfer credit based on College Credit, or Part 141 Certificate
- **X** needs to take a knowledge examination for the rating and pass with an 80%.
- Y needs to enroll in the flight lab and complete a progress check to practical test standards.
- ✓ Students transferring from Part 141 programs need to present their training record or graduation certificates for evaluation.
- ✓ FAA regulations allow the transfer of a maximum of 25% of the total hours of a course from Part 61 institutions and 50% of the hours from another Part 141 school.
- ✓ Knowledge examinations can be both oral and written.
- ✓ Quiz outs need to be accomplished as soon as possible, preferably within the first week of the semester so that unsuccessful candidates can add/drop appropriate classes.
- ✓ Once a student starts at KSU-Salina they may not obtain ratings from other sources and transfer them to KSU-Salina.
- ✓ All transfer students must take a written KSU-Salina Policy and Procedure examination.

Students who earn professional aviation credits (PAV) from K-State for outside ratings may not apply those to the PPIL degree option unless they complete a flight proficiency course where they demonstrate knowledge and skills for the rating(s) received. PAV courses do not count for reduced ATP credits.
